

Summary of the previous activities

Time period: 2021 and 2022

Activities overview



- The previous team of the society attempted to fulfill its obligation to hold elections and provide good conditions for new candidates to join the board of directors and executive team of the society by hosting the annual assembly in the last months of 2021. Unfortunately, no former association members were put forward for the new term.
- Only five of the attendees at this meeting were nominated to serve on the new board, and one of them chose to volunteer rather than take on an official role. This was one of the important aspects of what happened that may be examined afterwards. The individuals' names were as follows:

Activities overview



- The old and new teams both made an effort to make the transfer period go smoothly, but sadly, this did not occur in practice. Making a framework for the transition period that is effective despite the simplicity of the process seems to be another thing that needs to be considered. The society's bank account as well as its Telegram, Instagram, Facebook, and Gmail accounts are among the transferred items.
- At the time of the team switch, the account balance was around \$4,200.
- Unfortunately, Mr. Maziyar Mohammadi Nik verbally announced his resignation after a while; as a result, the association only had three official members and one volunteer. Due to administrative, personal, and numerical limitations, the society did not then have the structure outlined in its constitution and bylaws.
- Five meetings were held by members during that time period. The majority of these meetings were intended to organize Nowruz-related cultural events in 1401 and 1402.

Activities overview



- Because of constitutional concerns, it was challenging for the society's members to decide to participate directly in organizing and holding events related to the #Mahsa movement. Finally, the group of volunteers who planned the protest activities collaborated with the society's social media team to promote the events on its social media channels. Of course, each member worked individually with a group of volunteers to help with the activities for the #Woman_life_freedom movement.
- Making sure that the society's constitution is understood clearly in the face of such circumstances is one of the suggestions that may be made for the future.
- The society's annual meeting took place in March 2023. The single candidate present was chosen to join the board of directors at the meeting's conclusion.
- It was concluded that the most crucial action moving ahead concerning the annual and intra-team meetings would be to call an extraordinary assembly to maximize the association's capacity to accomplish its goals.
- The subsequent actions have been developed in the meantime, as will be discussed.
